at the pivotal moment in the history of the united states of america ratification of the constitution was championed by james madison john jay and alexander hamilton in a series of newspaper

Starting on 25 September 1787, 8 days after the final draft of the US Constitution and running through the early 1790s, these Anti-Federalists published a series of essays arguing against a stronger and more energetic union as embodied in the new constitution.

Over the course of the last century, scholars have furiously debated four questions concerning the founders and their act of creation: were the framers motivated by their economic interests? How democratic was the framers' constitution? Should we interpret the founding using philosophical or strictly historical approaches? What traditions of political thought were most important to the framers?
